MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: S-D5 IMPLEMENTATION PLAN
DATE: JANUARY 2, 2008

Over the next 36 months the Crime Laboratory Division plans to phase out the S-D2's currently used in the field and implement a new screening device, the S-D5.

Due to the grant funding guidelines, several changes in the screening device program are necessary:

- Agencies wishing to receive the new S-D5 screening devices through grant funding must submit their request on agency Letterhead indicating the number needed.
- The Toxicology Section will assign and keep a record of which agencies receive new devices.
- Once an agency is selected to receive the new devices, the agency will receive a training CD, handouts, testing material, and devices to complete a self certification for their personnel. The agency will be responsible for completing the required training and submitting the paperwork to the State Toxicologist for officer certification.
- The agency will be responsible for maintaining POST Board Standards and sending necessary paperwork to the POST Board directly.
- After receiving the new screening devices the agency will be responsible for ordering mouthpieces, and other consumables (fuel cells), and for repairs.
- Due to a decrease in grant funding, in addition to assuming all costs for the S-D5's, effective October 1st, 2008, the laboratory will not be supplying mouthpieces and fuel cells or repairing S-D2's currently in the field.
- A state contract for purchasing S-D2 and S-D5 mouthpieces will be available in the near future.

These changes are necessary in the screening device program to enable the Breath Program to operate more efficiently and ultimately better serve the Law Enforcement Community.
